

VILLAGE OF ALMONT
PUBLIC NUDITY ORDINANCE
ORDINANCE NO. 175

An Ordinance to prohibit public nudity within the Village of Almont and to protect the public health, safety, general welfare, societal order, and morals of persons and property owners.

THE VILLAGE OF ALMONT ORDAINS:

Section 1. Public Nudity Prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in public nudity within the Village.


Section 2. Definitions. The following words and terms, when used in this ordinance, shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section.

- (A) *Public Nudity* means knowingly or intentionally displaying in a public place, any individual's genitals or anus with less than a full opaque covering, or a female individual's breasts with less than a full opaque covering of the nipple and areola. This includes, but is not limited to, any such display for payment or promise of payment of an admission fee or membership fee.
- (B) *Public Place* shall mean any governmentally owned or controlled property and any land or building to which the general public is invited or permitted to enter upon, including, but not limited to, business establishments open to the general public, as well as any business establishment, declaring itself to be a membership organization or club, that has as one of its primary purposes the display of nudity as previously defined.

Section 3. Violations. Any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be subject to a penalty not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) fine, or imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment.
